THE FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT

Sunday, March 17, 2024

GOD'S DIVINE SERVICE TO US: *In the Holy Sacraments, We Share the Glory of the Cross of Christ* Jesus catechizes His disciples in the way of the cross, revealing that He will be condemned and put to death *"and after three days he will rise"* (Mark 10:33–34). But the Twelve do not understand. Instead, they argue among themselves about who will be the greatest, with James and John

requesting the places of honor on either side of Jesus in His glory. However, Jesus has come to make Himself the "slave of all" and "to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mark 10:43–45). He shares the true glory of His cross with all who are baptized with His Baptism and with those who drink His cup of salvation, the New Testament in His blood (Mark 10:39). By these Holy Sacraments, the Lord makes Himself known to all His people, forgiving their sins "from the least of them to the greatest" (Jer. 31:33–34). Though He is the very Son of God, "he learned obedience through what he suffered" and so became our great High Priest, that we may enter His glory by the way of His sacrifice (Heb. 5:8–10).



WELCOME! What a blessing to gather together to worship the One True God! The Lord will bless your worship as he brings His gifts to you through Word and Sacrament. May we all respond with prayer, praise and thanksgiving. We invite you to prepare for worship in silence and prayer. Remembering your Baptism, you are encouraged to make the sign of the cross when you see this symbol + in the bulletin. If you are a guest, Pastor Olsen would love to meet you and we ask that you sign our Guest Book located in the front hallway.



WORSHIP WITH CHILDREN: Worship is a time for the entire family to be together to hear the Word of God, for faith comes by hearing (Rom. 10:17). Therefore we encourage parents and children of all ages to sit together in the service. Understanding it is difficult for little ones to sit for long periods, *Totes for Tots* activity bags are available as you enter church (*by the information table*) for children to use during the worship service. Each bag contains books

and quiet toys. Please return the bags and their contents after the worship service. Thank you! A *Cry Room* is also available in the Preschool/Mrs. MacKenzie's room (east hall), where you can listen to the worship service.



Lord's Prayer



For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen. The Lord's Prayer is the model prayer Jesus taught to the disciples (Matthew 6:9-13). Sometimes it is called the Our Father, after the first words of the prayer.

The Words of Our Lord

P Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take eat; this is My + body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."

In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My + blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

The words spoken by Christ when He instituted the Sacrament of the Altar; the pastor speaks these very words of Christ at the consecration of the bread and wine.

Our Holy Communion Practice

In Holy Communion we are joined in a personal way with Christ and with one another as we receive the body and blood of our Savior Jesus Christ under the bread and wine for the forgiveness of our sins. Therefore, out of faithfulness toward God, and in sincere love that seeks to guard the spiritual well-being of all who would commune, Emmaus practices Closed Communion.

Holy Scripture clearly teaches that those communing together be unified in their confession of the faith and also that those who commune unworthily do great harm to themselves. When a person partakes of the Sacrament, he/she is also confessing his/her unreserved agreement with the doctrine and practice that is proclaimed from the altar and pulpit of which the Sacrament is administered. Therefore, we ask you to refrain from communing if you are not a member of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. All others are still welcome to come forward, crossing your arms to receive a blessing. Please speak with the pastor about receiving instruction to learn what Scripture teaches and our church confesses. We pray fervently for the day when Christ returns and all divisions will cease.





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

EMMAUS MONTHLY STEWARDSHIP FOCUS



MARCH: STEWARDSHIP OF GIVING: MONEY, PART III

Stewardship Goal:

Courageously Confess Christ through the vocational aspects of Whole Life Stewardship now and into the next generations.

On the first day of every week, each of you is to put something aside and store it up, as he may prosper, (1Co 16:2 ESV)

<u>Family Stewardship Discussion</u> Read the Bible verse above aloud first.

- 1. We have studied giving as first from God, that we are cheerful, hilarious, givers, and that our fruits are first given to God, displaying that we trust in Him and put Him first in our lives, not only on a Sunday morning, but even in our bank account. But how much do we give? Does the Bible tell us a set amount we give?
- 2. We give proportionally. Look again at the passage above. St. Paul encourages them to give according to what God has given to them. He does not ask you to give from what you do not have and each has differently. **Read also 2 Cor. 8:12**. Kids who get an allowance can give proportionally according to what they have. Retirees on fixed income can give according to what they have. Whether salary or by the hour, you can give according to what God provides for you. There is no exact amount. God will take your cheerful, proportional first fruits and use it for His Kingdom!
- 3. What is proportionally for you? Does that change if your income changes? If you don't give as such, pray that God would help you give cheerfully, from your first fruits and proportionately according to what God has blessed you.
- 4. Look up these verses as well: Ex. 35:5, 21; 2 Luke 12:34, 2 Cor. 8:7

He regards even human beings beset by weakness or sickness high enough to take on our condition Himself (Hebrews 5:7-9). The Gospel just leaves no room for abortion or assisted suicide.


