
His Name Shall Be Called....

⁶ For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. (Isaiah 9:6 ESV)

Too often, we overlook the wonderful Gospel given to us in the Old Testament. Isaiah is a particularly rich source of both God's Law and Gospel. Unfortunately, we either disregard the Gospel proclaimed in the Old Testament, which reveals the promises of God, or we consider it only during Christmastime.

Once again, we are presented with the marvelous message of Christ's coming—the fulfillment of God's promises in the person and work of His one and only Son, Jesus Christ. In our midweek services, we will focus on Isaiah 9:6 and examine how Jesus Christ fulfills the names given in this prophecy.

On the Sunday morning prior to the midweek service, we will explore in detail each of these names: **Wonderful Counselor**,





We are using Luther's Large Catechism as our guide and are currently studying the Third and Fourth Commandments. As we look forward to the coming of Christ, we anticipate both the celebration of His birth at Christmas and His return on the Last Day.

"And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, 'Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away.' And he who was seated on the throne said, 'Behold, I am making all things new.' Also he said, 'Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true.' And he said to me, 'It is done! I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. To the thirsty I will give from the spring of the water of life without payment. Letter from the Congregational President


Dear brothers and sisters of Emmaus,

As we wind down our church year in the Gospel and prepare for the new church year beginning with Advent, we recently held our November Voters Meeting to showcase the recent work of our boards. I attempted to get a more consistent format, and the feedback has been positive. Each board presented what they accomplished in the prior year, what they are working on in the year ahead, and ways that they need help either through people or prayers. Or both.

During the Leadership Summit in August of 2023, I challenged every board to narrow their goals to three per team with the focus of delivering on goals rather than have a large list and maybe get around to some incrementally. As a result, everyone had positive momentum and encouraging news to report. We are getting good things accomplished. In our upcoming leadership summit, we are approaching our goalsetting using three themes: **Fears, Forward, and Fellowship**.

The first involves confronting a Fear. It is not a typical topic in a church support setting, but I believe that making fears a safe topic to discuss, we can make some headway on some of our unsaid concerns that linger in the background. One key feature (bug?) of our Old Adam is we have concerns or genuine fears in our respective boards and let it eat away at us. This goal may allow us the opportunity to confront a fear by identifying it, sharing it, and seeking the Lord as well as one another for courage and strength to address it.

The theme for each board's second goal is moving Forward. Most of our groups are small ("but mighty!" as Mrs. Durlacher reminds us) and it is easy to be consumed with our day-to-day duties and really not gain ground year after year. However, as we are about to embark on our next 125 years of ministry at Emmaus, we

important but a bit challenging for a later date. This is an opportunity to work together and deliver some larger items to strengthen and expand our ministries at Emmaus as well as getting to work with members we might not normally encounter.

One of my favorite reasons for being at Emmaus is that if you have a heart for service, you can make a positive impact here. Larger, well-heeled churches are easy to drift into and out of and get lost in the flow of milk and honey. Part of what makes Emmaus a family is we see each other throughout the week wearing our different hats. Nearly every board has the potential to level up with just one more person (like you) whether on a project or working towards one of their goals. I have been excited to have adjusted our Council agenda in recent months to formally approve someone new joining the board.

You do not need to be an expert to volunteer. We have several friendly mentor types around to train you up. Most boards meet once a month (and usually take June and December off) and stay current via email or group texts. Some boards meet via Zoom if you cannot make the trip to Emmaus yet want to remain involved - you can. If you have ever wanted to try out a different talent God has blessed you with that you do not have opportunities to try more in your day-to-day existence, consider this your call. Are you interested in developing a new talent or skill? Consider this your call. You could even put your new skill on a resume or LinkedIn if you are a career type at this stage in your life.

If you are not sure where to start, please feel free to ask me or Pastor or anybody else you regularly see here, and we can help you find a fit. **Every board welcomes prayers and has specific petitions to share at the meeting.** Some boards have more immediate needs that would benefit from an extra member or two including Property, School, and Finance. We have other former boards that now continue in more of a project/work group format due to not having enough people, so there are even less formal on-ramps to service as well.

I look forward to serving you in the new year and would love to help you discover your role as our 125th year dawns soon.






