

From the Desk of Pastor Olsen: A Crossroads

We are at a bit of a crossroads in our congregation right now. It may not seem like it, you may not notice it or it may not be something that you recognize because it doesn't impact you closely; but Calling a new principal is a significant change, not only to the school but to the congregation as well. I speak as one from both sides of the coin, one who has Called a number of principals, and one who has served twice as a principal. Trust me when I tell you, that it does make a difference in the congregation, as well as the school.

We would be amiss to think that the principal is only here for the school. The principal and the teachers are Called by the Congregation, not by the school. It is not just a unified budget that we have, but it is a unity of head, heart and hands, all of us together as church, school and preschool. A principal makes an impact on the life of the entirety of Emmaus Lutheran. This is why this is such an important time for Emmaus. We have had many faithful principals in the past, and we will have opportunity to thank Mr. Martin down the road, but right now we turn to the future of Emmaus.

We have installed our Principal Call Committee. We have already been diligently at work and have set up an entire time table to move forward. We are working both in meetings and between meetings, engaging one another in emails

and conversations so that we may use the best of the time we have, first to the glory of God and secondly so that we are diligent in our duties serving the congregation. As pastor, I want to thank these people for the time and effort they are not only putting in now, but the many, many hours ahead in the time frame we have. These are solid people making wise decisions for the sake of the Lord's Church.

Now you may not be on the Call Committee, but that does not mean you do not have a role to play. Your most important role is to pray! Pray for the committee and the work that has to be done. Pray for the church, school and preschool that God provides us with a brother or sister in Christ that will joyfully, with a Christ-like heart, lead our school forward. Pray for the teachers and staff of the school. They need your prayers each and every day as they bring the Gospel to these children and their families. Pray for our unity as one body in Christ, that any divisions that might be here cease; that the Devil would not gain a foothold throughout this process or find a way in to divide us whether within church or within the school itself with parents, students and teachers. The Devil is always searching for a door, a window that is cracked open just a bit, so that He can squirm his way in a try to destroy the work that God is doing here.

Pray for our new principal. We do not know who he or she is, but God does. So let us start praying for that person, that God would prepare them to be a part of our family and that He would provide for the congregation and school that they are led here from. This new principal needs our prayers now. Pray for the families in our school that God's Word would reach them amid the struggles in their lives; that the unchurched would find a home with us; that those struggling with work, parenting, marriages or health and finances look to Christ for their hope and peace. And pray that the Lord would provide us with ample opportunities for new families in our church, school and preschool, so that we might share with them the love of God in Jesus Christ, His victory over sin, death and the power of the Devil, and that there is forgiveness and new life in Christ Jesus.

Now does that give you enough to do? If not, then add then these words from Hebrews 10, *"²³ Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. ²⁴ And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, ²⁵ not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."* (Heb

10:23-25 ESV) So let us hold to that confession of faith that we have so blessedly been given, Courageously Confessing Christ. Let us encourage one another for God has given us to one another to build up the body in love, doing good works which God has set out beforehand for us to do (Eph 2:10). And finally, let us not stop coming to worship together as brothers and sisters in Christ, meeting at His table to receive that most blessed of gifts that He has given us, the forgiveness of sins through His Word and Sacrament. Getting a principal doesn't begin with a process, but it begins with a people gathered around Word and Sacrament, receiving the gifts of God and going forth out of His love for us, to love our neighbor.

We are at a crossroads in the 122-year life of Emmaus, but it is one that God will lead, guide and direct as He always has for Emmaus. We will trust in Him and work together as His children for the glory of the Son of God, who came to take away the sin of the world, who came to take *your* sin away.



Lent Worship

Lent is the penitential time of preparation before the celebration of Jesus' resurrection. It's 40 day duration (not counting the Sundays in Lent) begins on Ash Wednesday. In the early church, Lent developed as a time of intense instruction for those who would be baptized at the Easter Vigil. The name comes from the Anglo-Saxon word for "spring" and the Old English word for "lengthen," as in the lengthening of days with the approach of spring.

Principal Call Committee

After the announcement at the last Voters' Assembly of the retirement of Keith Martin at the end of this school year as Principal of Emmaus Lutheran School, church leadership organized a Call Committee to assist in the calling of a new Principal.

Church Leadership undertook a challenge to make this Committee inclusive of the various groups in the congregation (school families, member families, non-member families, young members, older members, faculty etc.). To that end, Church Council developed a team of individuals that will serve as the Call Committee. They are as follows:

The first order of business is to review the relevancy of the present Principal Job Description and tie it into the present and future needs of the school. Also, several groups will be surveyed regarding their thoughts about the characteristics needed for a Principal at Emmaus. The congregation, school families and faculty will be surveyed or interviewed for their views. Changes to the Job Description could be made after the surveys and interviews, or it could remain substantially the same.

Through the assistance of the Indiana District of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we will filter through potential candidates arriving at an appropriate number to ascertain interest in a Call to Emmaus school. If interested, an initial telephone call will be made to each candidate with a second, more in-depth conversation. We will get an appropriate slate of candidates for consideration of the congregation in order to issue a Call.

After the Call has been extended, the candidate and their family will be invited and hosted by Emmaus for a visit to our church and school. After the visit, the person will make the final decision and convey that to the members of the Call Committee who will in turn notify the congregation.

We have a very aggressive timeline of having the calling process completed by May 1, 2022. The congregation, as with any other Call, will meet and decide to extend a Call to one individual. You will make the final decision.

All of this will be done by May 1, 2022. We have much to accomplish. Please include this process in your prayers. If you have any additional ideas, please see any of the above members of the Call Committee. Periodic updates will take place every-other Sunday in the announcement period at the end of the Divine Service.

What if we do not make the abovementioned date of May 1, 2022? Plan "B" is being discussed as the hiring of an Interim Principal for the following school year. We will have more about that process if and when we need to implement such a plan. (continued on pg 6)

Once again, pray for your church, your school and the leaders involved in this process. If you have names of potential candidates, please feel free to complete one of the forms that will be in the rear of the sanctuary, beginning on Sunday February 6, 2022. This is a very aggressive schedule and process. We need your prayers to help us, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, to succeed.

2022 Allocations

Our monthly meeting was held on January 19th, and the process of allocating our funds began as follows:

So far, we have committed almost \$6,000 with more requests and money grants to come to our February meeting.

1. Our recurring expenses will be about \$2,000 - including: Portals Of Prayer; Fort Wayne Lutheran; Altar Guild supplies; Communion, Baptism, and Confirmation expenses; Bulletin print licensing; Clip Art; Member Caller charges; vocal choir and handbell choir needs; pulpit supplies, etc.
2. Church -- \$2,000 to help defray Higher Things Conference costs for our high school youth attending;
3. School athletic teams - \$700 for updating sports equipment for our teams.

4. Church Office - \$500 for a new typewriter - used to complete required forms, etc.
5. Handbell Choir -- \$150 for new music.
6. Vocal Choir -- \$300 for new music.

God in Man Made Manifest

The season of Epiphany focuses on how God was made manifest in the flesh of Jesus. The church spends time hearing of the miracles, signs, and wonders of Jesus in the world. And this made plain to all that Jesus really is who He said He was. He is the Second Person of the Holy Trinity, the only begotten Son of the Father, in the flesh. For “the Word became flesh and dwelt among us” (John 1:14).

It is revealed for all the world to see that Jesus is God in the flesh. It is made manifest by His words and His work, by what He said and by what He did. And these belong together, for “the Word became flesh and dwelt among us.” Jesus is the Word and will of God in the flesh, that is, He is the walking, talking enactment of God’s Word.

It is no different for us. We are called not just to believe in God in hearts but also to trust in God in word and deed. As James wrote: “But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves” (James 1:22), and again, “What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? ... So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead. ... Show me your faith apart from your works, and I will show you my faith by my works. ... For as the body apart from the spirit is dead, so also faith apart from works is dead” (James 2:14, 17–18, 26).

Our faith is lived out in works for our neighbor. Our trust in the Word and will of God is lived out not in word only but also in deed and in truth. In other words, the Epiphany of the Lord creates in us an epiphany of our faith in our works of obedience to God who commanded them. By this, our faith is made manifest to the world. It is, as Luther wrote of faith:

Faith is a divine work in us. It changes us and makes us to be born anew of God (John 1). It kills the old Adam and makes altogether different people, in heart and spirit and mind and powers, and it brings with it the Holy Spirit.

Oh, it is a living, busy, active, mighty thing, this faith. And so it is impossible for it not to do good works incessantly. It does not ask whether there are good works to do, but before the question rises, it has already done them, and is always at the doing of them.

He who does not these works is a faithless man. He gropes and looks about after faith and good works and knows neither what faith is nor what good works are, though he talks and talks, with many words about faith and good works.

Faith is a living, daring confidence in God’s grace, so sure and certain that a man would stake his life on it a thousand times. This confidence in God’s grace and knowledge of it makes men glad and bold and happy in dealing with God and all His creatures. And this is the work of the Holy Spirit in faith. Hence a man is ready and glad, without compulsion, to do good to everyone, to serve everyone, to suffer everything, in love and praise to God, who has shown him this grace.

And thus it is impossible to separate works from faith, quite as impossible as to separate burning and shining from fire. Beware, therefore, of your own false notions and of the idle talkers, who would be wise enough to make decisions about faith and good works, and yet are the greatest fools. (*Preface to the Book of Romans*)

So, then, let our faith be active by God’s power in the Word through the Holy Spirit. And let then our faith be made manifest to the world by what this faith does: serving our neighbor – in church, in the family, and society – with the works of faith in time, talents, and treasures.



Going to the Hospital?




