THIRD SUNDAY IN LENT

GOD'S DIVINE SERVICE TO US: *The Crucified and Risen Body of Jesus Is the True Temple of the Lord* The Lord rescues His people, Israel, *"out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery"* (Ex. 20:2) and makes His gracious covenant with them, defined by the Ten Commandments. Since He has

become their God by His grace, they shall be His people, having "no other gods" before Him (Ex. 20:3). He is "jealous" for them as a husband for his wife and as a father for his children. He has named them with His name and called them to rest in Him (Ex. 20:5–9). The incarnate Son, Christ Jesus, is likewise jealous for His Father's house, because it is to be a place of divine grace and Sabbath rest for His people, and not "a house of trade" (John 2:16–17). His zeal consumes Him as He gives up "the temple of his body" to the destruction of the cross, but in three days He raises it up again to be the true temple forever (John 2:17–21). By His crucifixion He cleanses the entire household, and in His resurrection He becomes "wisdom from God, righteousness and sanctification and redemption" (1 Cor. 1:30).



WELCOME! What a blessing to gather together to worship the One True God! The Lord will bless your worship as he brings His gifts to you through Word and Sacrament. May we all respond with prayer, praise and thanksgiving. We invite you to prepare for worship in silence and prayer. WORSHIP WITH CHILDREN: Worship is a time for the entire family to be together to hear the Word of God, for faith comes by hearing (Rom. 10:17). Therefore we encourage parents and children of all ages to sit together in the service. Understanding it is difficult for little ones to sit for long periods, *Totes for Tots* activity bags are available as you enter church *(by the information table)* for children to use during the worship service. Each bag contains books and

quiet toys. Please return the bags and their contents after the worship service. Thank you! A *Cry Room* is also available in the Preschool/Mrs. MacKenzie's room (east hall), where you can listen to the worship service.



It has its own special language like we do in our workplaces. It has its own customs like we do in our families. Every Sunday we learn more of worship and faith. The liturgy is where God reveals Himself to us and gives us Hs gifts. Here we learn who He is and how to respond to Him. The words of worship come from the Scriptures and its form has been used for 2,000 years. So don't worry if it all seems strange. You learn by practicing - join us each week!


Holy Scripture clearly teaches that those communing together be unified in their confession of the faith and also that those who commune unworthily do great harm to themselves. When a person partakes of the Sacrament, he/she is also confessing his/her unreserved agreement with the doctrine and practice that is proclaimed from the altar and pulpit of which the Sacrament is administered. Therefore, we ask you to refrain from communing if you are not a member of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. All others are still welcome to come forward, crossing your arms to receive a blessing. Please speak with the pastor about receiving instruction to learn what Scripture teaches and our church confesses. We pray fervently for the day when Christ returns and all divisions will cease.








MARCH: STEWARDSHIP OF GIVING: MONEY



Stewardship Goal:

Courageously Confess Christ through the vocational aspects of Whole Life Stewardship now and into the next generations.

He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him **graciously give** us all things? (Rom 8:32 ESV)

<u>Family Stewardship Discussion</u> Read the Bible verse above aloud first.

- 1. Stewardship of giving money begins with the Divine generosity and giving nature and work of God. Share with the family ways in which God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit, has been, still is and will always be generous. Search these: Gen. 2:22, Matt. 26:26-28, John 3:16, 1 Cor. 3:6, Gal. 1:4, 2:20, Eph 4:11,12, 1 Tim. 2:5,6. There are many more!
- 2. Stewardship of Giving begins and always begins with God's gracious and giving nature as Creator, Redeemer and Sanctifier. We give because He first gave to us. We receive joyfully His many gifts, especially through Word and Sacrament. If God gives us all things, not out of our good works and deeds but His grace and love, what do we have to worry about? Are you not giving, not giving first fruits or Tithing out of fear? And if that is the case, is that fear out of a lack of trust in God? Please be honest with yourself, for God already knows the answer to this question.
- 3. What do we do when we do not fear, love and trust in God above all things? Ps 32 says it best, "I acknowledged my sin to you, and I did not cover my iniquity; I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the LORD," But the Psalm does not end there, "and you forgave the iniquity of my sin (Psa 32:5 ESV) Confess your sin, your lack of trust in God and ask for His strength to change. He will forgive you and provide what you need as He always has and will, for He graciously gives forgiveness and life!

(Exodus 20:12-14). He holds human life as highest priority and will not accept any other creatures as replacement (John 2:15-16). Body and sexuality serve to enrich life – our own as well as one another's – and not to eliminate it.




